

PROJECT POUCH

Quick instructions for making this Project Bag

We have not used a pattern for this project, we have cut the fabric to suit our needs. Customise your project bag to the measurements that suit your requirements.

Determine the size of your project.

- Cut 2 x Pieces of fabric 1 inch bigger than your finished measurement.
- Cut 1 x piece of Soft and Stable & Stable
- Sandwich your Soft and Stable in-between your 2 pieces of fabric and quilt as desired. Have fun here, practice free motion, use your BSR, rulers, ripper rings, trim to finished size.
- Decide how big you want your plastic window to be and cut to size.
- Cut three pieces of your quilted fabric. Two for either side of your zip and 1 for the bottom strip. Fold over raw edges, approx a standard seam allowance on the long edge, press folded edge and top stitch onto the plastic.
- Fold over place the folded sides of your fabric against your zip edges and top stitch into place.
- Place the two pieces wrong sides together, open the zip, trim and stitch all the way around.
- To finish bind the raw edges as you would for a quilt, mitre the corners for a nice finish. You can make your own binding (this can be on the straight grain) or use purchased bias binding if you prefer.
- Turn the binding to the wrong side and stitch as desired.
