Fabric / Notions

- Remnant of curtain fabric
- Firm water-soluble embroidery stabilizer
- Wire 0.3 to 0.35 mm thick
- Polystyrene ball, approx. 5 cm diameter
- Wooden dowel and hot-melt adhesive
- CutWork tool, CutWork stitch plate + Foot no 44 or scissors





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Hoop water-soluble stabilizer and the fabric in the oval hoop. Prepare the machine for embroidery: Attach the straightstitch or Cut-Work plate and foot no 44C, or alternatively foot no. 15. Start and stitch out the embroidery fill.

After the fill, the placement lines for the wire are stitched out.



Apply the wire between the two placement lines. Embroider the basting stitch for securing the wire with the foot control rather than with the start/stop button – this allows you to adjust the embroidery speed to circumstances whenever wished. The straight edges can be sewn more quickly. Slow down just before you reach each corner. Wait for the corner in each case and bend the wire around when you reach it. Carry on guiding the wire evenly.

For the flowers, cut off the wire with approx. 6 cm allowance. Roll up the wire ends again and place in the opening of the opposite petal.



Stitch out the coverstitch as usual, keeping an eye on the machine and if need be turning away the wire ends before oversewing. A stabilizing run is embroidered at the same time in order to hold the fabric in place for cutting.

Cut the flowers either with the CutWork tool or the scissors. When using the CutWork Tool make sure that the knife is in position 1.

Work around 6 hoopings with 3 flowers each.



Thoroughly rinse out the stabilizer from the petals.

Twist both wire ends on the finished and dried sections of the flower. Bend petals upwards.

Cut off all ends to approx. 4 cm length and stick into the polystyrene ball.

Hot-glue the wooden dowel into the ball.
