Jenny Bosman

I did not use non-woven fabrics, choosing rather to face the neat edge issue. I overcame the issue by using applique paper to stick my fabric down. I enjoyed to Step fill technique part of the design, and added 3 different options here. The flower centre has a pin wheel look to it, the green floating bubbles are the same technique detailed in the notes and the orange and bronze bubbles are inspired by part of a design given free by Bernina. Design is 143 x 239mm not quilted to enable more freedom in design later.

Natalie Baker



This has been an emotional roller coaster $\$. I'm working with a Designer Plus V6. My biggest hoop is a 5 x 7 so I had to do my design in two halves. I printed my design on paper, cut out all the small pieces, glued the paper to my material with temporary fabric adhesive then glued the material to my block (I made an outline to stitch out first, slightly smaller than my material so I would know where to glue the pieces $\$). I attached my hoop, closed my eyes and hoped for the best $\$. This is the first time I have used the

star fill effect. Loved it. I used it on the small white flowers too. Loved the way the stitches of each petal face out 😉. Can't wait for the next challenge 😀

I first battled to line the lines up for the cut, place and blanket stitch for perfect appliqué. But then I found the solution. Cutting the petals without marking them was also a learning curve. Overall this was a great experience

I loved this challenge!

I used the reshape tool to fix stitch angles and to delete stitches in the blanket stitch part of applique and to do some adjustments in the quilting part. The trimming is the hardest part.

While moving the branch to its final place it lost 3 blanket stitches, which I have seen to late. Will fix this by hand.

The fabric is a bit bigger than 20 x 30 cm, I will trim it back when assembling the final project in challenge 6.
