


Stitch 'N' Turn Doughnut #19999-019 / 1 Design

Note: Some designs in this collection may have been created using unique special stitches and/or techniques. To preserve design integrity when rescaling or rotating designs in your software, always rescale or rotate designs using the handles directly on-screen.



Listings below indicate color sample, stitching order and suggested thread color number. "T" refers to Isacord thread and "T" refers to Timeless thread. Colors beginning with 20501 refer to YLI Fine Metallics, 7 refer to Yenmet Metallic, 8 refer to YLI Variations Variegated Thread and 9 refer to Isacord Multicolor Variegated.

Some solid areas shown are not stitched.

- L Design is larger than 5" (127 mm) in either direction.
- S Design is smaller than 1.5" (38.1 mm) in either direction.

Stitch 'N' Turn Instructions

- 1. Hoop a single layer of medium weight tear-away stabilizer.
- 2. Spray the stabilizer lightly with temporary adhesive spray.
- 3. Stitch the first color, which is the "Placement Guide Stitch". Use a thread color that blends with your fabric choice.
- 4. Place a piece of fabric right side up onto the tear-away stabilizer, being sure to cover the "Placement Guide Stitch". **See Photo 1**
- 5. Attach the hoop to the machine and stitch the second color, which is the "Icing".
- 6. Stitch next color which is the "Center Cut Line". See Photo 2.
- 7. Place another piece of fabric right side down directly over the first piece. If desired, pin or tape at corners to secure.
- 8. Stitch the final color change (through both layers of fabric). Use a thread color that blends with your fabric color. For photography purposes we've purposely used a contrasting thread.
- 9. Remove the hoop from the machine and the fabric from the hoop.
- 10. Using embroidery scissors, carefully cut out the stitch 'n' turn project close to the seam stitch line. Cut around the stitches at the opening to create a tab. **See Photo** 3.
- 11. Clip curves and corners as needed. Cut inside the center cut line through both fabrics.
- 12. Turn the project right side out. Use a chopstick to turn out corners and curves.
- 13. Using a small zigzag stitch, stitch along center opening.
- 14. Stuff with polyester stuffing. Fold tabs in and slip stitch the slit closed with hand needle or insert a piece of fusible webbing and fuse closed.

For Extra Fun:

• Stitch embellishments on your projects to dress them up. Please keep in mind the age of the person to be using them then plan (or omit) add-ons accordingly.

Supplies:

- 2 pieces of fabric one inch larger (in all dimensions) than chosen design
- Medium weight tear-away stabilizer
- Temporary adhesive spray
- Embroidery thread
- Polyester bobbin thread
- Embroidery machine
- Polyester stuffing
- Hand needle or fusible webbing
- Embellishments beads, glitz, etc
