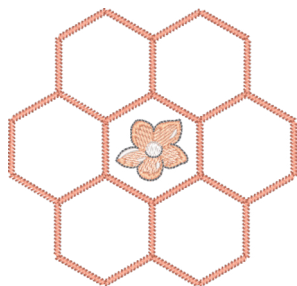


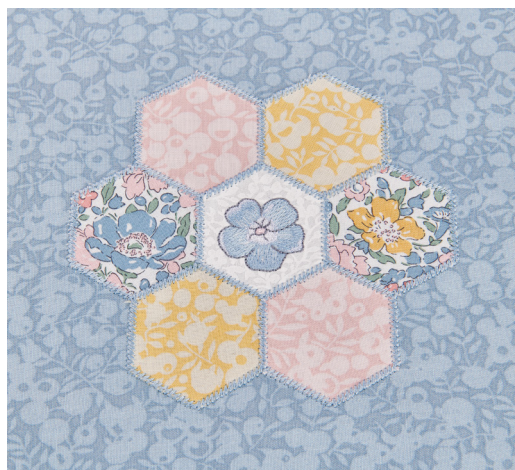
# BERNINA 580 Liberty Edition

## Flower Garden Appliqué Blocks



### Designs:

*Glen Lyon 24, Glen Lyon 25,  
Glen Lyon 26, Glen Lyon 27,  
Velasco 21, Velasco 22,  
Velasco 23, Velasco 24*



### Instructions:

Create the hexagon Flower Garden blocks with the trim in place appliqué technique. In this technique, a piece of fabric is placed over the placement stitch, cut, and then embroidered in place. You will stitch each hexagon individually and then add the decorative top stitching at the end.

**TIP:** Heavily starch your appliqué fabrics before for a cleaner cut when trimming.

- Step 1 Prepare seven fabrics for the applique hexagons: one center and six petals. Cut approximately 2-1/2" (6.5 mm) squares.
- Step 2 Hoop the background fabric in the Large Oval Hoop with a layer of tearaway stabilizer.
- Step 3 Load the design from the Glen Lyon or Velasco folder on the machine.
- Step 4 Thread the machine with a color that matches your hexagon fabric. Place the hoop on the machine. Stitch Color 1, Fabric Placement Stitch.
- Step 5 Remove the hoop from the machine leaving the project in the hoop. Completely cover the placement stitch with your first hexagon fabric. You can use a bit of sewing glue to keep in place.
- Step 6 Return the hoop back to the machine. Stitch Color 2, the Cut Line and Tackdown, using the same color that matches your hexagon.
- Step 7 Remove the hoop from the machine leaving the project in the hoop. Trim around the hexagon design as close to the stitching as possible being careful not to trim the stitches.
- Step 8 Return the hoop back to the machine. Stitch Color 3, the Placement Stitch for the next hexagon.
- Step 9 Repeat steps 4-7 until all 7 hexagons are stitched (Color 1-14).
- Step 10 Finish through the colored steps matching the thread color as indicated for the center motif and decorative stitching.

Use these blocks in quilt projects, as pillows, or as small projects such as zipper bags.
