

# Raglan jumper "Tiam"

## Model 323-35

### Size 92-116



#### PRINT THE CUT

1. Open the pattern PDF and set the control square to Page 1 with the setting "Original size" on DIN Print A4 paper (US-Letter). (Do not click on "Adjustment to page size"!) )
2. Check the square – if it is 10×10 cm, print out the whole cut sheet.
3. Place all pages next to each other as indicated by the arrows and adhere them row by row along the boundary lines, then glue the rows together.
4. Compare the body measurements with the table measurements and cut out the cut parts in the appropriate size. (The overview of the cut parts is on the pattern sheet.)

**Important:** Instructions do not include seam allowances, unless otherwise indicated!

#### SUPPLIES

- 0.5 m sweat fabric, 165 cm wide
- Fabric and tulle scraps for the appliqué
- Remnants of sewing yarn
- Velcro fastener, 5 cm wide
- Tear-away stabiliser

- BERNINA embroidery machine
- BERNINA [Overlocker L 890](#)

#### CUTTING

Note: Only use very stretchy fabrics!

- 1 1× front part on the fold
- 2 1× back part on the fold
- 3 1× neckline cuff on the fold
- 4 2× sleeve

2 sleeve cuffs: 14 up to 16×8 cm, final width 4 cm.

#### INSTRUCTIONS

1. **Dinosaur:** Hoop the fabric with the tear-away stabiliser in the embroidery hoop. First embroider the placement line to put on the sewing yarn remnants. take the hoop out of the machine, spread the yarn remnants so that approx. 2 cm are covered to the left of the line. Everything to the right of the line will be visible later. Leave the threads at least approx. 4 cm long. **Tip:** The threads do not have to be laid accurately next to each other. Place thread nests, the threads are cut back later and any loops that might form are cut open later. Cover the threads on the left from the placement line with a strip of tulle. Next colour: Embroider the grid to fix the threads under the tulle. Remove the hoop from the machine, trim back the excess tulle and any threads on the left. Finish embroidering the file, covering the threads on the right so that the Embroidery Foot does not get caught in them. Cut back the threads to the desired length. **Tip:** Non-embroiderers will find the pattern for the dinosaur as a pattern piece.
2. **Interchangeable pieces:** Hoop tear-away stabiliser in the embroidery hoop. Embroider the appliqués, including colour 18 and take the hoop out of the machine. On the

back, stick hook and loop pieces with spray adhesive wrong side on wrong side over the embroidery elements (with the lollipop, only over the circle). Cover everything with tear-away stabiliser and refit the hoop. The rectangular border now fixes the stabiliser to the bottom side. Finish embroidering. Remove the stabiliser and carefully cut back the Velcro tape just next to the fixation outline.

3. **How to sew the sweater:** Cut a circle of approx. 3 cm in size from the loop side of the velcro tape and sew it on next to the arms of the dinosaur.
4. Thread the overlocker for a 4-thread overlock or a 3-thread super stretch stitch. Close the darts of the sleeves. Sew the sleeves right side on right side to the front and back parts. Close the neckline cuff to form a ring. Fold it lengthwise into the fold with right sides out. Sew in the cuff according to the markings. Close the sleeve seam and continuously the side seams. Close the sleeve cuffs to form a ring, fold them lengthwise with the right side of the fabric out. Divide the cuffs and sleeve hem into quarters and sew them together quarter by quarter. Hem the T-shirt.



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
