

Dress "Elina"

Model 123-35

Sizes 92-122



PRINT THE CUT

1. Open the pattern PDF and set the control square to Page 1 with the setting "Original size" on DIN Print A4 paper (US-Letter). (Do not click on "Adjustment to page size"!))
2. Check the square – if it is 10×10 cm, print out the whole cut sheet.
3. Place all pages next to each other as indicated by the arrows and adhere them row by row along the boundary lines, then glue the rows together.
4. Compare the body measurements with the table measurements and cut out the cut parts in the appropriate size. (The overview of the cut parts is on the pattern sheet.)

Important: Instructions do not include seam allowances, unless otherwise indicated!

SUPPLIES

- 0.6–0.7 m cotton jersey, 155 cm wide
- Remnant of cotton jersey for the pocket
- Woven interlining G 710 (Vlieseline)
- Solufix (Vlieseline)
- Soluvlies (Vlieseline)
- BERNINA embroidery machine

CUTTING

- 1 1 × front part on the fold
- 2 1 × back part on the fold
- 3 2 × sleeve

Neckline cuffs: 34/35,5/37/38,5/40/42 × 2.4 cm, final width 1.2 cm.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Determine the position of the embroidery on the front part and iron the interlining in this area on wrong side of the fabric. Let it cool off thoroughly. Hoop one layer of Solufix in the hoop, peel off the backing paper and stick it onto the area to be embroidered. Place two layers of Soluvlies on top and fix it via the function "Basting". Embroider the file. Wash out the stabilisers.
2. Hem the upper edges of the pocket with a coverstitch and sew on the pocket according to the pattern.
3. Close one shoulder seam. Iron the neckline cuffs wrong side on wrong side along the fold. Mark the cuffs and neckline in quarters and sew them right side on right side together. Close the second shoulder seam and side seams.
4. Hem the sleeves with a coverstitch. Close the sleeve seams and sew in the sleeves. Alternatively, for very small sizes: sew the open sleeves into the armholes and then close the side and sleeve seams continuously. Hem the dress.



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
