



Paw Print Stamp Hooping Tips

Use the BERNINA CutWork Tool to create your own Paw Print stamp or stencil! Choose your medium of choice - craft foam - template plastic - or even freezer paper!

Supplies

Machine & Accessories

- BERNINA Sewing & Embroidery Machine
- BERNINA CutWork Accessory & PawPrintDraw.DRAW file

Notions

- 5½" x 8½" sheet of 2mm Craft Foam OR
- Template Plastic OR
- Freezer Paper
- OESD Ultra Clean & Tear



Hooping Tips

Template Plastic

- Hoop one layer of Ultra Clean & Tear.
- Lightly spray the outer edges of a pre-cut piece of template plastic, with 505 Spray adhesive, and adhere to the center of the hooped stabilizer.
- Place the Cutwork Tool in the machine and "stitch" the design by cutting out the shapes.
- Use 505 or 404 Adhesive spray to adhere the stencil to the desired project, and paint with the desired medium.

Craft Foam

- Hoop one layer of Ultra Clean & Tear.
- Lay one foam piece on the hooped stabilizer and embroider Color 1 to baste the foam in the hoop. (Use pre-cut (5½" x 8½") pieces of 2mm Craft Foam.)
- Thread the needle and stitch Color 1 to baste the foam to the hooped stabilizer.

- Place the Cutwork Tool in the machine and complete the design by cutting out the shapes.
- Use the negative image of the foam as a stencil, and adhere the positive portions of the foam cutout to a scrap piece of wood to use as a stamp.

Freezer Paper

- Hoop the multiple layers of Freezer Paper (I recommend from 6 to 8 layers). No additional stabilizer is necessary.
- Place the Cutwork Tool in the machine and complete the cutting.
- Remove the Freezer Paper layers from the machine - be mindful of any small pieces which may fall loose. Iron the Freezer Paper stencils to your project and paint with desired medium.
