


Circular Embroidery Attachment #83

Almost any stitch or technique can be sewn in a circle as easily as a straight line if you have the correct tools. Circular Embroidery Attachment #83 makes it simple to sew circles using almost any presser foot, any stitch, and any technique.

Anatomy of the Circular Attachment #83





Circle Stitching Tips

Stabilize fabric using interfacing, stabilizer, and/or batting. The fabric needs to be firm to turn smoothly on the pin.


Make sure the fabric can turn easily without being inhibited by the side of the machine. Roll up the edges of the fabric and pin them if needed.

Use the same presser you would use if sewing the chosen stitch or technique in a straight line.

If the machine is not in a cabinet, use the slide-on table of the machine for support.

Circles from 1½" to 10½" in diameter can be stitched with BERNINA Circular Embroidery Attachment #83.

Use any stitch to sew circles. When sewing a decorative pattern, use an odd-numbered notch and the patterns will usually match.





When stitching letters, use the attachment on both the right and the left sides of the needle to make the letters readable on both the upper and the lower curves.

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
